

## Research Experiences for Rhode Island Educators Aboard University of Rhode Island's Research Vessel *Endeavor*

The University of Rhode Island Graduate School of Oceanography (GSO) is once again announcing an opportunity for Rhode Island educators to go to sea aboard its research vessel *Endeavor* in May 2016.



Eight to ten berths are available for a cruise from Friday to Sunday, May 27 through 29. The educators will work alongside GSO scientists on the 185-foot ship, towing a plankton net, collecting water samples, using oceanographic research instruments, and conducting experiments in the "wet lab." Participants will learn various research techniques for studying the biology, physics, chemistry, and geology of the sea.

The telepresence technology aboard the ship will allow participating educators to communicate with their students in the classroom. This cruise will depart from and return to the University of Rhode Island's Narragansett Bay Campus. Additional opportunities for educators to participate in cruises aboard *Endeavor* between mid May and early June may be available.

The Rhode Island Teacher-at-Sea Program, funded by the State of Rhode Island, is open to Rhode Island residents who teach in Rhode Island in a K-16 setting. Educators of all disciplines, both formal and informal, are welcome; participants do not need to be science teachers.
